


# **National Marine Plan Review**



### Scope of Review

- To consider whether the National Marine Plan is meeting it's objectives (High Level)
- To consider the outcomes of monitoring of the NMP

#### . . . . . . . . .

- To determine <u>whether</u> the National Marine Plan should be reviewed, <u>not</u> to review the content of the National Marine Plan
- To be completed by March 31<sup>st</sup> 2018

## **Baseline Development**



- Scotland's Marine Atlas supported 1<sup>st</sup> NMP
- Final OSPAR Regional Assessment due Autumn 2017
- MSFD Regional Assessment due 2018
- .....Scotland's 2<sup>nd</sup> Marine Atlas? 2019-20?
  - How should we structure the information?
  - What do we need at National / Regional level?

## **New Responsibilities**



- From 1<sup>st</sup> April 2017 new powers were devolved to Scottish Ministers':
  - Crown Estate Scotland
  - Decommissioning for Offshore Renewable Energy
- Implications for NMP / RMPs?
  - Scottish Minister's commitment to devolve inshore revenue from CES
  - Decommissioning liabilities / opportunities?

  - Meeting COP21? North Sea Energy?



#### **Scottish Marine Regions**






- The Marine Scotland Act allows for the creation on Marine Regions and the delegation of powers to a local level
- 11 Scottish Marine Regions
- Extent of Regions is from MHWS to 12
   nautical miles
- Delegation of Regional Planning to Marine Planning Partnerships
- Working to develop Marine Planning Partnerships (MPPs) in a step-wise manner.

### **Regional Marine Planning**

#### **Scottish Marine Regions**





- Roll-out of Regional Marine Planning expected to take a number of years
- Shetland Isles and Clyde are first 2 areas to take forward Regional Marine Planning
- Lessons learned from these will inform the next MPPs

### Marine Planning Partnerships progress...

- Shetland Delegate
  - Shetland Islands Council and the NAFC Marine Centre
- Clyde Delegate
  - Clyde Marine Planning Partnership and the public authorities (total 23 members)
- Progress:
  - **Shetland MPP**
  - Prepared an Assessment (Draft) of their region
  - Drafting their Statement of Public Participation Clyde MPP
  - Prepared an Assessment (Draft) of their region
  - Drafting their Statement of Public Participation
- Orkney Islands the next MPP Region announced June 2017


